2023 - 2024, was another fruitful and gratifying year in the weCan journey. There some were new beginnings, and some which were not so new, got better and better. weCan does have a long way to go, but has come a long way and we are proud of that. We are happy that we managed to continue touching lives of those 2000+ children who need it the most, the ones challenged physiologically or financially.

We proudly present the activities, progress and development during the year gone by.

The highlight of the year was **Anandadhara- the first weCan concert.** It was special because finally our children with special needs were not only able to face an audience but also perform independently. This journey is always long and full or hurdles but the hard work of the educators and parents is paying off. The kids of Savitur were the heroes of the show.

Another new beginning was **Saatvik-the pre-vocational skill building unit.** Children with special needs often cannot follow a mainstream academic curriculum but they can definitely attain functional academic goals which could lead to vocational opportunities. The whole purpose of education is to make children into independent productive adults irrespective of the curriculum they follow, irrespective of physiological or financial abilities.

Another new milestone in the weCan journey was the kickstart of the much needed gap filling in the development between **education and employability.** To be able to bring education to a fruitful outcome, certain skills make all the difference. weCan started personality and confidence building sessions which include communication, digital literacy and functional Mathematics.

Sahaay-our programme of setting up open schooling study centres within mainstream schools has been a high point during the past year. Besides the kids coming to the centre, children who belong to under-priviledged institutions now will have access to this alternate route to attaining class 10 and 12 certification, within school hours and within school premises. Another very effective way to bring education to a fruitful outcome, irrespective of the curriculum they follow.

Learning camps, a tried and tested concept aimed at enhancing learning outcomes through activities rather than chalk and talk, pencil & paper is now being implemented by weCan too. These will be conducted in all our partnering schools as part of our Suryoday programme. Planning, fine-tuning and orientation sessions are underway and implementation will follow soon thereafter.

Technology step up @weCan has been with the same objective-activity based learning-the upcoming **ABL App.** It will detail all activities, teaching learning material and also provide an exhaustive library of worksheets and videos to achieve academic skills required in the primary school level. The app will be shared with the teaching fraternity of schools and institutions absolutely free of charge.

Our outreach programme-**Suryoday** is ever evolving and besides the regular services of academic assessments, mentoring & training sessions, special education services etc., they are also immediate beneficiaries of all our new initiatives which will all contribute to bettering teaching practices. We started conducted **pre-vocational assessments** to gauge interests and aptitude of children who are likely to follow a vocational path instead of the regular academic path.

Savitur, the school for children with special needs continues to make a difference in the most innovative ways. The sensitive passionate team at weCan does not leave any stone unturned for achieving those short term and long term goals for outlined for each individual child with varying needs. We celebrated all special days and festivals, in special ways, and we hope that we get many more reasons to celebrate in the coming year.

Awareness on special education needs and inclusive practices is still a large gap even in the education communities. People can really only care about the things they know, see and experience. Our work is primarily about inclusion, it is our moral duty to create this awareness and passion amongst all stake holders and it will be a major focus in the coming year.

Training The Trainers is an important part of our annual calendar and each session is carefully planned, well in advance, conducted by senior experienced experts. We do not want to miss out on any of the new ways which can benefit our kids.

We are happy to report that all **statutory compliances** are in place. We make sure that we keep to all government requirements and guidelines thoroughly and accurately.

The Management

Anandadhara-2023

On the 18th of October, 2023, weCan Learning Resource Institute put on their first annual day programme titled "Anandadhara". Anandadhara translates to 'a stream of happiness' and that was the theme which served as the starting point while planning the programme. The events were varied, some were a reflection of Bengali culture, some were tributes to great artists and some just about the sheer joy of performing. There were makeup artists and costumes hired to make the children look stage ready. The chief guest was Smt. Sharmila Biswas, a Sangeet Natak Academy Awardee.





Anandadhara started with a Ganesh Vandana performed by 3 Suryoday children who come from underprivileged backgrounds and 2 of our Savitur children, one with Learning Disability and the other with Autism. All the girls were in their teens and performed beautifully to the tunes of "Ekadantaya Vakratundaya".





No show in Kolkata seems to be complete without a tribute to the great artist Satyajit Ray. A medley of his songs was selected on which students, teachers and parents performed together. Most of the students in this song were children with Autism and needed some form of cuing and prompts. However, with the use of different props and colourful costumes, the event was a visual treat.





We had two of our children sing songs with the support of their parents. Aishiki has autism and Sohini has a very rare condition called Rubenstein Taybi Syndrome. There was an initial hesitation with the microphones but once they got into their songs they were magical.



Our second tribute was to the Bollywood hero Raj Kapoor. Rajanya played the synthesizer like a pro while four of our other children danced with hearts in their hands.



It's not every day that we have a father daughter duo perform on stage. We were lucky as Rushoti and her father performed an audio play live for us. The bond between the father and her daughter was a treat to watch on stage.



Our tiny Suryoday children, all under 10 performed on the tunes of Chote Chote Tamashe and the audience was all awes for these tiny tots.





Any 90's child who was ever into English pop music has heard of the Vengaboys. Our children danced to the tunes of 'We like to Party' with energy and joy. The performers were a mix of children with autism, hearing impairment and learning disabilities.





Bengali culture is incomplete without Rabindranath Tagore. Some of our underprivileged Suryoday children performed a rhythm performance on 'Momo Chitte'. They used steel glasses, a table and ghungroos to create rhythms with the song.





At weCan we teach Communicative English to the underprivileged children. A demonstration of their skills was given through the recitation of "Where the Mind is Without Fear" by Rabindranath Tagore and "A Happy Child". The audience were amazed at how clearly they recited both poems.



This spirit of Pujo was displayed by the teachers of weCan who danced to "Gauri Elo"



The performance by Star Mission Academy children was vibrant and colourful too, in keeping with the pujo spirit in the city. It and ended the programme on a festive note.

In line with our vision and mission of taking education to every child, we have now started NIOS Study Centres within school hours and within school premises. We are happy that we are giving these children to fulfill their academic goals while still being a part of a mainstream set-up. Inclusion is the way forward and this is one of the ways. We aim to offer this service to as many schools as possible, touching the lives of more and more children, the weCan way.



Education to Employability-Beyond Academics

A comprehensive approach to education would be a good foundation in academics, social and emotional well-being and general awareness of surroundings. Also the gap between students and employable adults can be bridged by developing some life skills like communication, functional Mathematics and digital literacy. These are skills required to get that upper edge, to be successful in any profession.

During the year gone by, this programme started with around 75 children. It started well, it is still getting fine tuned and will soon be structured and ready to be able to benefit many more children specially from vernacular backgrounds or first generation learners. Our team is constantly working towards creating modules, structuring activities and building content for the same.










Content Creation @weCan

Content Creation has always been a continuous and essential part of weCan. It started with a belief that every child has individual learning needs and hence needs customized teaching learning material. Later when school partnerships became the focus, content creation became customized to those requirements. We first identify needs of different projects, define goals, put down the relevant skills and then the content team plans the required content. We have just completed a comprehensive manual for the Pre-primary section which includes strategies for each skill and the teaching learning material required, besides exhaustive number of concept building sheets and practice worksheets. Currently there is large amount of AV material, worksheets and assessment sheets being created for OBE-A, OBE-B and also for the senior secondary syllabus of NIOS.



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Technology Step Up @weCan

Besides the weCan software dedicated to assessments and report generation, we have an online library too specially since we had to deal with Covid in education. We also have dedicated systems for recording everyday work and of course accounting systems

The latest addition to technology in education at weCan is the new app for Activity Based Learning. This app will be accessible to all our partnering schools-the objective will be to help teachers teach every concept in the primary level using activities instead of chalk and talk. All skills required in English & Mathematics are detailed along with the teaching learning material required and of course exhaustive worksheets fo practice and assessments




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Training the Trainers















Most other workshops and training programmes revolved around good teaching methodology in Mathematics, English, creative writing and communication.

Learning Camps

Language learning is crucial in and of itself, and as the basis of communication, and comprehension, it also acts as a catalyst for the sound understanding of other subjects, related concepts, and ideas. Unless and until a child has a strong hold on language, he/she would not be able to successfully grasp other subjects accurately. Therefore, language acts as a core competency, necessary for knowledge acquisition and understanding. Apart from being a medium of exchange of views, ideas and opinions, Language acts as the common thread which runs through and links each subject, each concept, and each notion to one another.

Listening, speaking, reading, and writing are the underlying competencies in the development of Language skills. A few more ancillary skills like vocabulary, phonetics, grammar, understanding, and self-evaluation also contribute to the process.









With all the above criteria in mind a 3/5-day intensive learning camp is designed with a focus on develop core competencies required for language acquisition and understanding.











Objectives:

The first and most important objective in providing learning camp is to ensure that the children's skills are brought up to par with the class they belong to

Learning camp provides an opportunity for immersion in listening, speaking and cognitive reading and writing activities for the children who are acute language learning deficiencies.

The camp is designed in a very participatory and activity-oriented way as the students learn better through activities and hands on experiences within a stipulated time













Role of Camps in Remediation:

Learning camps are conceptualised to bridge the knowledge gaps in an intensive manner within a short time frame. Inability to read, or lack of basic literacy skills in one's mother tongue – a subject that it also the medium of instruction is a very big challenge for a child who finds that with every passing day the gap between what he/she knows and what he/she is expected to know, keeps increasing faster and faster. Camps at the beginning of an academic year are a base bridging strategy to help children overcome those areas of doubt and complexity that comes in the way of acquisition of new knowledge. The camps are usually of 3 to 5 days duration giving children an opportunity to get immersed in a language learning situation for 5 hours a day successively.

The Baseline paper is set in a manner that is able to capture the learning gap.

The instructional design is targeted as per their learning needs. It also takes into consideration the fact that different children have different learning styles. Individual targets are set and teachers sit together at the end of the day discuss among themselves the experiences of achieving those targets. Teachers at the learning camps believe that though the camps have a grave mission to accomplish, but that should not alleviate the lighter moments of life. And that's why activities such as painting, music, role play, debates and discussion form an integral part of these camps too. However, the activities should have a direct link to the main task at hand. The famous educationist Mr. Howard Gardner talks about multiple intelligences that human beings are capable with. There are seven types of intelligences- verbal-linguistic, logico-mathematical, spatial, musical, kinaesthetic, interpersonal and intrapersonal. The activities of the camp allow for these different types and offer a wide range of choices to the children.
